A LOW TAX PLAN TO CREATE JOBS

Both the Conservative government's federal budget, presented by Finance Minister Jim Flaherty* and the Conservative's election platform contained a lot of good policies to create jobs and boost economic growth.



A new Hiring Credit for Small Business to support local job growth, an expanded work sharing program and major new investments to help the agriculture, forestry and mining sectors grow.



Cut Red Tape: A One for One Rule: The Conservatives will legislate the following rule: Every time the government proposes a new regulation, it must eliminate an existing one. The rule will be designed to maintain the highest standards in all areas, including health and safety, while promoting a culture shift in government, in favour of the needs of Canadian small businesses.



Capital Cost Allowance extension: We will extend the 50 per cent straight-line accelerated Capital Cost Allowance rate for manufacturing or processing machinery and equipment, by an additional two years.

FARM AND RANCH

The federal budget allocated \$50 million in new funding for an Agricultural Innovation Initiative to support research.

The Conservatives created a new \$3,000 volunteer firefighters' tax credit. Brad Trost has long been a strong supporter of this tax credit to attract more recruits.

The Conservatives also waived license renewal fees for hunters and firearm owners.

We will strengthen the rights of landowners by reviewing the *Species at Risk Act* with the aim of ensuring that compensation is paid when owed.

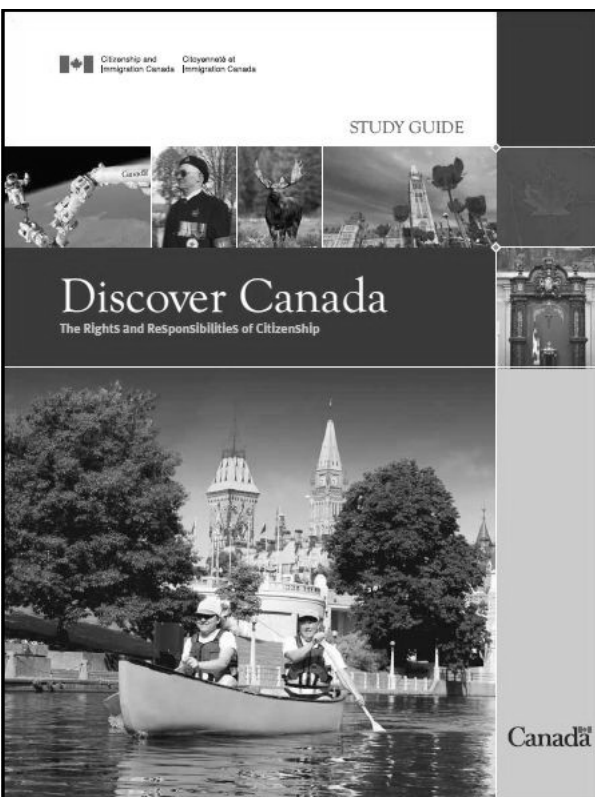
